Don't Close the Books on Libraries!

News that the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners must cut its 2011 budget by 17% and that the regional library's budget will be reduced by 28% prompted area librarians and library supporters to travel to Boston in November to urge state legislators to restore library funding. A similar rally was held in Greenfield to protest the disproportionate cuts to that library's budget for this year. In the days that followed, news came that the regional bookmobile will cease operation in December.

Concurrently, during these economic tough times, libraries are seeing more visitors than ever.

Despite the grim news, Tilton Library will continue its effort to provide the best in books, services and programs and to meet growing demands. Although December 5th will be the last bookmobile visit, deposit collections of books on tape and large print books will still be available from the regional library until the end of June. Most important, regional delivery service remains intact and Tilton Library's book budget has been boosted by several generous donations. Watch this space for updates on budget news.

Catalog Searching – How to Find Our DVDs and Audio Books

To see a list of Deerfield's collection of DVDs go to the C/WMARS catalog at <http://wmars.cwmars.org/search>. Under Other Searches on the right, choose Number Searches. Click on the Dewey Call # tab on the left and select Deerfield from the scroll down menu. Type in DVD and click submit. The list begins with non-fiction (documentary type) DVDs and moves into feature films. To find audio books follow the above directions except type in audio instead of DVD.

Adopt-a-Shelf - Volunteer Positions

Arrange and check books, CDs, DVDs and periodicals on library shelves to make sure they are in order. The position offers a flexible timeframe for individuals who are detail-oriented, love to keep up with library materials and work independently.
