In fiscal year 2007, Deerfield residents paid approximately \$25 per capita to support Tilton Library. Anyone who has priced the cost of books lately knows that \$25 will get you little more than one bestselling title in either book or DVD format at the store. Miraculously, it will get you much more at Tilton Library. In addition to traditional library offerings such as books, classic VHS movies and reference services, we offer new DVD titles, free high-speed Internet access, large-print materials, audio, digital and downloadable books, over 70 magazine subscriptions, and local newspapers. Passes for free admission to the Eric Carle Museum, the Children's Museum at Holyoke and the Springfield Museums are available on a first come first serve basis to all library patrons. Deerfield residents may borrow a pass for free admission to Magic Wings Butterfly Conservatory. Readers Advisory – Gentle Reads

What is a gentle read you might ask? "Gentle Reads are 'feel good' books. They contain no strong language, explicit sex or violence, reflect conventional values and usually end happily. They take the reader back to a gentler, less hurried time. They are cheerful, hopeful stories, told from a soothing perspective." (Saricks)

Here are some popular authors of the genre: Jane Austen, perennial favorite for readers interested in 19th century English life; Maeve **Binchy**, writes gentle stories of women that explore the fabric of women's lives and their relationships; Agatha Christie, timeless and clever, always a favorite for those who enjoy a cozy mystery; Fannie Flagg, Fried Green Tomatoes, one of many feel-good books that deals with small town life in the South; **Dorothy** Gilman, master of the cozy mystery genre; Elizabeth Goudge, her books express her love of life and her faith in the power of goodness; Jan **Karon**, her Mitford series feature the heartwarming tales of Timothy Kavanaugh, an Episcopalian priest; **Garrison Keillor**, an NPR regular and classic author of the genre with a penchant for depictions of rural life; Alexander **McCall Smith**, his No. 1 Ladies Detective Agency series offers a gentle mystery with a side of humor. My Reading History

Did you forget to write down the name of a really good book or can't remember the last episode you've seen of "Foyle's War"? Do you want be able to look back on what library items you've checked out in the past? You can track your own circulation history by turning on "My Reading History" in the C/WMARS catalog. This is a strictly voluntary option that is confidential and only accessible by you.

To start, visit the C/WMARS website at http://wmars.cwmars.org/search/

- 1. click on LOGIN
- 2. log-in or create an account
- 3. click on My Reading History
- 4. click on Opt In

After you opt in, any item you borrow from any C/WMARS library will be included on your Reading List when you return it.

To delete any item from the list:

- 1. check the box under the column <u>Mark</u> for the title you want to delete
- 2. click <u>Delete Marked</u> to remove from your list

To stop using the Reading History feature click on <u>Delete All</u> and then click on before <u>Opt Out</u>. No matter what you decide, be sure to click on <u>LOG OUT</u> at upper right.
