Her latest book, *The Writing Circle* has been issued in paperback and is the story of a writer who joins a western Massachusetts writing group. "Hearts break and emotions are pushed to the limit in this richly engaging tale of love, betrayal and literature." Reading Connections:

See our display on top of the books-on-tape shelves (near the photocopier and online catalog) for these modern British (mostly women) writers.

Faith Fox by Jane Gardam - A motherless baby named Faith is the linchpin of this delightfully eccentric comedy of manners and miracles.

Talking to the Dead by Helen Dunmore - The story of two sisters bound by a terrible tragedy in childhood.

Behind the Scenes at the Museum by Kate Atkinson - Ruby Lennox is a quirky, complex character who relates the events of her life and those of her dysfunctional family with equal parts humor, fervor and candor.

The Marriage of the Sea by Jane Alison - An absorbing tale of love among the ruins. *Arlington Park* by Rachel Cusk - The roiling inner lives and not-so-quiet desperation of young mothers in a well-to-do London suburb.

Everything Will be Alright by Tessa Hadley - A complex and intelligent family epic chronicling the lives of three generations of English women over four decades of social and political change.

Banishing Verona by Margot Livesey - The story of two people who enjoy an enchanted evening together, and then spend the next few weeks chasing each other across continents in order to decide if it's the real thing. (Livesey is actually from Scotland and lives in Boston. This story takes place in London and the U.S.).

The Marrying Game by Kate Saunders and *The Lost Art of Keeping Secrets* by Eva Rice – Two about women left with crumbling estates and no sure means of redeeming the family fortune.
