

Obstacles with the Current Building:

- > Accessibility
- > Space
- > HVAC
- > Energy Efficiency
- > Computer Availability
- > NEW Needs (COVID)

>ACCESSIBILITY:

- Only one bathroom, on one floor
- Narrow spaces
- Slow clunky lift (NOT an elevator)

>SPACE:

- Not enough space for number of books required by state...
 "WITH EVERY NEW BOOK,
- "WITH EVERY NEW BOOK,
 ONE NEEDS TO BE
 REMOVED."
- Teen "room" a narrow former closet >>
- No separate room for programs



>HVAC: The air we breathe


COVID has drawn attention to the fact that the library does not have the proper ventilation system for healthy air in a busy public space.

>ENERGY EFFICIENCY:

Old buildings are not energy efficient and have high heating and cooling bills.

> ANOTHER NOTE ON SPACE:

In order to be fully operational, libraries need ROOMS FOR OUR MANY PROGRAMS, as all libraries offer programs in their buildings. It is a big part of what we do.

OVERALL: Energy Efficiency



2nd Floor:

- A. More space for books
- B. More computers
- C. Teen Room
- D. Elevator
- E. Quiet Study
- F. New Restroom
- G. Meeting Room

Timeline:

- > Long Term Plans show growing needs of library for additional space: 2014 & 2019
- > A grant application is written for funding: 2014
- > A Tilton Building Committee identifies needs: 2015
- > A Project Manager is Hired for Guidance: 2015
- > An Architect is hired for the design: 2015
- > Community Meetings are held for feedback: 2016
- > A decision is made to renovate and expand existing historic building: 2016
- > A Grant is awarded for 50% of project cost (we are #15 on waitlist): 2017
- > A Tilton Capital Campaign Committee starts raising funds: 2017
- > We move up the waitlist to #2: July 2021
- > WE GOT THE MBLC GRANT: JULY 7, 2022!
- > WE HAVE 6 MONTHS TO SECURE FUNDING: JANUARY 7, 2023

THE BUILDING PROJECT:

What's Known:

- > MBLC grant offer July 7, 2022
- > Building square footage & grant program elements
- > ESTIMATED Cost (updated 8/22): \$12.3million
- > MBLC Grant Amount: \$4million
- > MBLC ONLY pays for library projects
- > Library committed to raising \$2million
- > If we are not able to fully fund project, we'd have to start from scratch many years from now.
- > Program Room would be fully staffed and ready to use.

What's Not (yet):

- > Building design / materials
- > Building expansion orientation
- > Energy costs of new building
- > Need for any additional staff (not likely)

Reaching out to build support...





...with help from community

- > Fundraising & marketing consultants have been hired
- > WORKING WITH OUR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN COMMITTEE
 - > More people want to pledge money to this project!
 - > Only current project in town that is fundraising, which shows real dedication on behalf of town residents, library trustees, and businesses.
- > PEITION OF SUPPORT being distributed to Deerfield taxpayers by volunteers
